

i) State Institute of Health and Family Welfare (SIHFW), Gujarat.

ROLE OF SIHFW:

- To provide advocacy to health managers and Policy makers in the thrust areas of Health care sector.
- To prepare training components on the basis of the gap analysis in the skills of health functionaries so that the community is to provide need based health care.
- To train the trainers, in planning, designing & implementing curriculum for various basic and vertical trainings in various maternal, child and public health trainings under RCH-II so that effective implementation of health programme can take place.
- To sensitize the trainees, so that they practice the health messages for self and make other practice for effective application in the community.
- To collaborate with esteemed training institutions i.e. NGOs, Private Sector or other public training institutions viz. IIM, MICA, SPIPA, CHETNA, Deepak Foundation, Sewa Rural etc. in the Professional Development Course training conducted at SIHFW.
- Networking with other State level training institutes and NIHFW.
- Monitoring Pre service basic and promotional paramedical courses.
- Evaluation of the basic and promotional Para-medical courses.
- In-services induction, orientation and refresher training courses for Medical Officers (MOs) and for Health Officials.
- Training Skill Evaluation (TSE) for faculties of training institute.
- Preparation and modification of different modules for various basic and vertical trainings.
- It plays vital role for implementation of concept of public-private partnerships by conducting Self Finance Institute admission process for Female Health Worker (FHW) / Auxiliary Nurse Midwife (ANM) for basic course.

ii) Health and Family Welfare Training Centre (HFWTC) and Divisional Training Centers (DTCs):

Divisional Training Centers (DTCs) are regional centers functioning under the umbrella of SIHFW. Under SIHFW, they conduct one year Multi purpose worker (MPW-Male) course, coordination of various vertical trainings in NRHM/RCH-II are IMNCI, Immunization, RTI/STI, AFHS, Induction training for new appointed Medical Officers (MBBS) of PHC. They have supervision and monitoring role for District Training team (DTTs), FHW, FHS/PHN schools.

Location : SIHFW have 5 regional DTCs as shown in map viz, One Health and Family Welfare Training Centre at Rajkot, and other FOUR Centers at Bavla, Padra, Sachin (Surat) and Aliabada (**Annexure – 1**).

Objective: The main objective of all DTCs is to enhance knowledge and skills of health functionaries especially MOs, so that they can work at their place with efficient and effective manner.

Facilities: All the DTCs have its own teaching as well as hostels blocks. They have large lecture halls and in some places auditorium. These centers are well equipped with all modern modalities and advance audio-visual aids i.e. LCD, Computer, Laptop etc. They have good sanitation and water facilities. Under the leadership and direct control of Associate Professors of DTCs. New four FHW school have started in the year 2011 in same premises.

Evaluation of training conducted at DTCs is continuous process. Evaluation during training is done after every session, pre and post test, informal discussion, on job evaluation during field visit etc.

iii) District Training Teams (DTTs)

DTTs are functioning under IPP-VII, aimed to train district level health functionaries of particular district.

Objective: To enhance capacity building of paramedical staff at grass root level to increase effectiveness and efficiency to perform their work at community level.

Location: There are 17 DTTs (**Annexure -2**) in Gujarat State as shown in map and planning to start Five more DTTs in gapped districts.

Functions: The main function of DTT is to give various training under NRHM /RCH-II i.e. IMNCI, NSSK, Immunization, F-IMNCI, AFHS, RTI-STI, ASHA etc. Basic function of DTT is to give on job training and supportive supervision and identify the gap and find out training need and give the training in that gap area. DTTs Co-ordinates with SIHFW, district officials and regional training center.

Evaluation: Evaluation of training is continuous process. Evaluation during training is after every session, pre and post test, informal discussion, on job evaluation during field visit etc.

iv) Regional Public Health Nurse Training Institute (RPHNTI):

Previously in 1981 Diploma Public Health Nursing (DPHN) course was carried out at Surat. Then this center shifted to RPHNTI, Vaccine Campus, and Vadodara from 2004. This DPHN course is recognized by Indian Nursing Council (INC) and the name of the course has changed by INC to DNEA & ECN (Diploma Nursing Education Administration and Elective Community Nursing)

Location: It is situated at Vaccine Campus, Vadodara as shown in map.

Functions: This batch comprised only 15 female participants who are selected on the basis of merits. This promotional course is 10 months duration (45 weeks) have curriculum sanctioned by INC. They conduct DNEA & ECN course – Planning, implementing & curriculum development, update of lesson plan, internal evaluation, examination and other administrative function and field activities.

Evaluation: SIHFW conducts final examination for this course.

v) **Female Health Supervisor Training Schools (FHSTs)**

FHS Course is a promotional course, compulsory for all Female Health Worker who are taking benefits of 9 /18 /27 grade pay, before they retired. It is six months course and they conduct training under various subjects like home visits, community exposure, and clinical exposure and to enhance supervisory skills.

Objective: To enhance the capacity building of Female Health Supervisor so that she can supervise and monitor their subordinate staff and give effective training and guidance to them in efficient manner.

Location: It is located at Surat and Rajkot as shown in map.

Functions: FHW School has main function to promote promotional course to all FHW before their retirement. They also participate in the vertical training under NRHM/ RCH II conduct in DTCs and DTTs as well.

Evaluation: SIHFW conducts final examination for this course.

vi) Female Health Worker Training Schools (FHWTS)

In district panchayat, all Primary Health centers and sub center have Female Health Worker post to perform different tasks regarding MCH at community level. Before they are appointed as a FHW, they have to pass 11/2 year basic course. This course is recognized by Gujarat Nursing Council and Indian Nursing Council.

Location: List of FHW schools is given in **Annexure -3** and its locations are shown in map.

Objective : To enhance the knowledge and skills to Female Health worker so that they can work at grass root level and in community level efficiently and effectively to perform mid wifery skills with confidence.

Functions: It coordinates with GNC for examination and registration of candidates for continuous internal evaluation according to the norms of GNC.

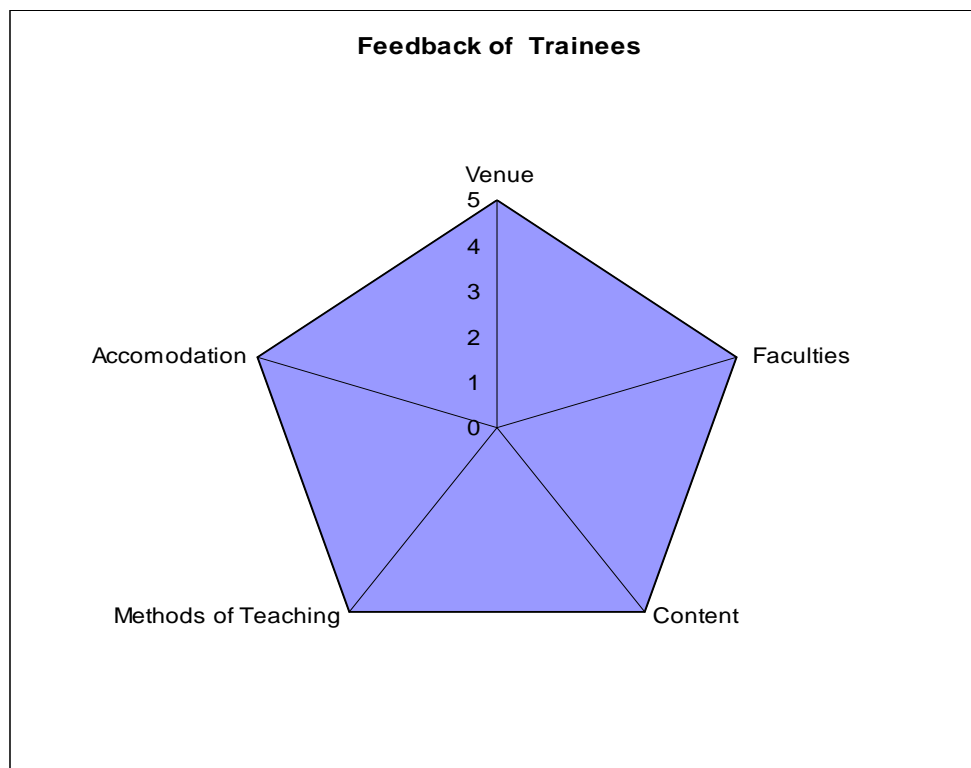

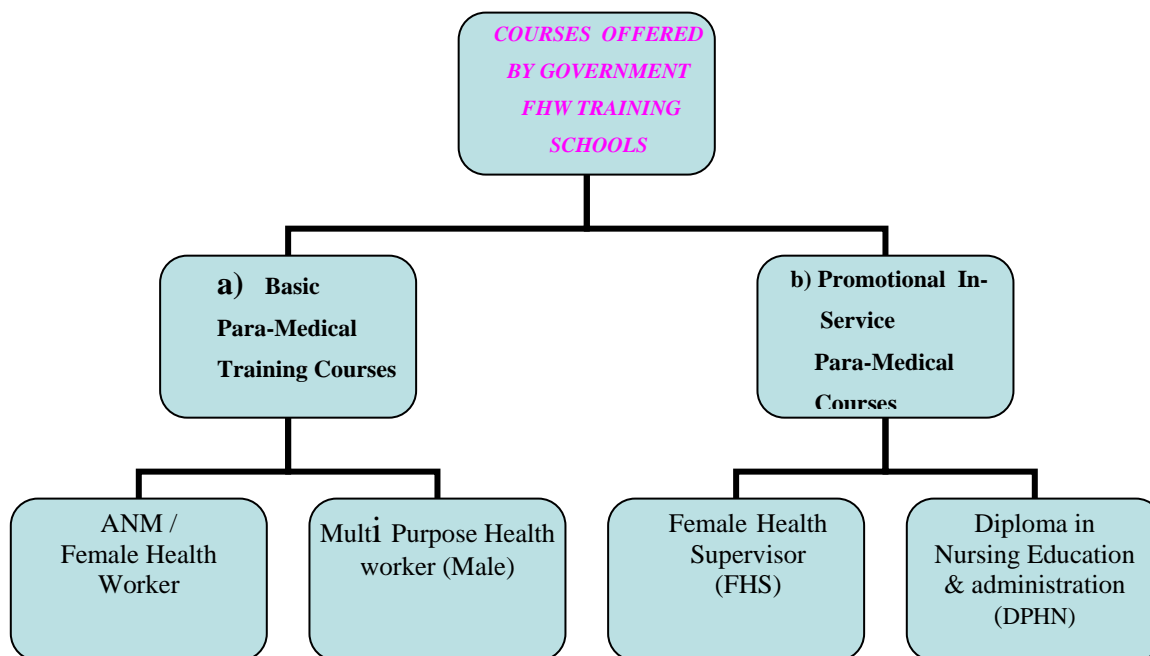

5 B) TRAINING SCHOOLS AND PARA-MEDICAL TRAINING COURSES:

1) BY THE GOVERNMENT INSTITUTES

There are two different types of courses viz, basic and promotional courses run to prepare para-medical staff in the field of the health run by Government training schools.



a) Details of Basic Para-Medical Training Courses

i) Basic course of ANM-Female Health Worker

Basic course of ANM-Female Health Worker is conducted under supervision of state level basic Training Committee for multipurpose Health Worker (Male & Female) headed by Director SIHFW. This committee has controlling power for policy suggestions in concern to admission, Supervision, Quality maintenance, Evaluation and Monitoring of the said courses. This is multipurpose health worker (Female) Basic Training Course i.e. Female Health Worker / ANM, run by Female Health Worker Training Schools in the State. It is recognized by both Indian Nursing Council & Gujarat Nursing Council since 2008. As per the syllabus recognized by Gujarat Nursing Council, 1½ years course is organized periodically at 26 FHW Training Schools **(Annexure -3)** which provides skill Training to health workers.

ii) Multi purpose Health Worker (Male) :

Basic course of Multi purpose Health Worker (Male) is conducted under supervision state level basic Training Committee for multipurpose Health Worker (Male & Female) headed by Director SIHFW. This committee has controlling power for policy suggestions in concern to admission, Supervision, Quality maintenance, Evaluation and Monitoring of the said courses.

This is one year multipurpose health worker (Male) Basic Training Course run under SIHFW. At present MPW (Male) Courses is conducted at 4 Divisional Training Centers (Bavla, Padra, Sachin and Aliyabada) and also at Health & Family Welfare Training Center, Rajkot. This course is as per the syllabus recognized by GOI and revised as and when by State Government. Government. GOI has modified the syllabus in year 2010-11 & SIHFW has also initiated the process for modification in the Course. This One year scheduled course is organized is every year which provide maximum 200 health workers for Rural Health Services.

II) BY THE SELF-FINANCE INSTITUTES (SFI) :

Concept of SFI

ANM/FHWs are basic health functionaries in the health system. To reduce IMR and MMR- additional FHW to be placed at each sub center under NRHM. Approximately 10 years to be required to complete the basic training load with existing 26 FHW government schools. Hence, SFIs to reduce the burden of govt. resources state has taken initiatives to allow Self Finance Institute to start ANM/FHW Schools in the state. Function of Primary Inspection for Essentiality Certificate by Health Department, is ongoing process by SIHFW. Process of Admission is under Chairmanship of Director, SIHFW.
